UNDOCUMENTED STUDENTS

The Marquette Undergraduate Application does not have an option for students to list themselves as "undocumented." Students should complete the regular online application, list themselves as citizens or permanent residents and then contact the office to change their citizenship status to the proper status.

If a student lists citizenship status as "Other," the undergraduate application will go directly to the Office of International Education. This process only delays the application process and the opportunity for students apply for academic and need based scholarships.

Undocumented Students and Financial Aid

Undocumented students cannot apply for the FAFSA, federal funding, or EOP, but they can apply for academic and need based scholarships, such as the Urban Scholars, Burke, Goizueta, Opus, etc.

Although need based aid ask students to apply for the FAFSA, undocumented students will work directly with the scholarship committee and complete the Marquette Net Tuition Calculator to verify need and EFC. NOTE: Students must include their contact information on the calculator for award processing. Undocumented students may also be asked to provide a copy of their parent's income tax forms.
