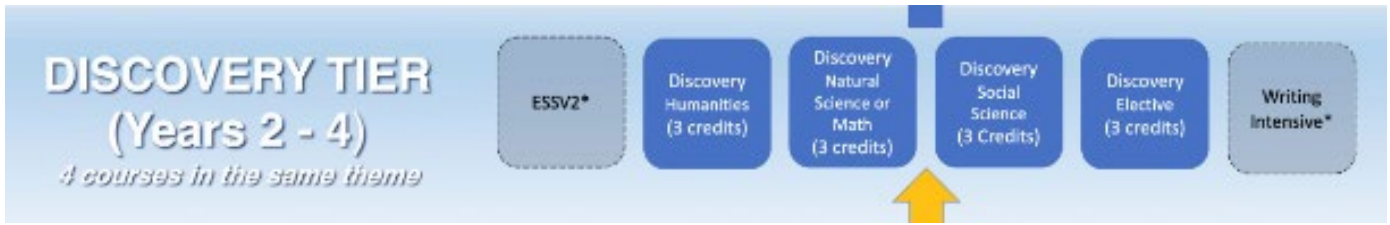


Determining your Marquette Core Curriculum Discovery Tier Theme, WRIT and ESSV2 Courses



Your graduation checklist looks like this:

MCC Engaging Social Systems & Values 2 - ESSV2 Requirement - Verify (Ref. #60)

Discovery Tier Theme

- Requirement for most students (except external Transfers bringing in 24 or more credits)
- Five Themes: Select a Humanities course, a Natural Science and Math course, a Social Sciences course and an elective from the same theme.
- Must declare a theme in order to have course boxes populate your Graduation Checklist.
- [Declare on CheckMarq](#) by the time you reach 60 completed credits.
- Can share credits for all 4 courses when possible with Business Core, Business Major and non-business minors; in addition to sharing with WRIT and ESSV2 requirements when possible. Courses do NOT share with Non-Business Electives.
- Do research to understand which theme is best for you: Marquette Bulletin link is at the bottom of the page.
 - Do you have AP/Transfer courses in a theme?
 - Are you an internal transfer student and your previous courses can help when in a theme?
 - Are you trying for a non-business major/minor? Look for more shared options.
 - Are you trying to be strategic with sharing business courses? Use this chart on the next page to help.
- If you take a business course in your theme that shares to the business core or business major, you can reduce overall credits by 3 credits (1 course). You can do this 2 times = 6 credits maximum.

WRIT (Writing Intensive) Course & ESSV2 (Engaging Social Systems and Values 2) Course

- Are courses you need to satisfy but you should look for options in: Discovery Tier Theme, Business Core, Non-Business Electives, Business Major, or Non-Business Minor options. Credits will share if you find a course in an existing requirement.
- Sometimes you can find a course that is both WRIT and ESSV2.

Students can dual apply ANY Discovery Tier Theme courses when possible to business core, major requirements, upper division business electives, non-business major/minor requirements, BUT NOT required non-business electives. Students can dual apply up to two business courses across Discovery Tier Theme requirements AND business core, major requirements or upper division business electives to reduce overall credits. Reducing credit requirements does not happen automatically, students must submit a Reduction of Credit form (Advising Central). When possible, students can use two 3-credit business courses (or 6 total credits) to reduce overall credit requirements. Courses that are used for business requirements but are not business, like MATH 1400 or CNEN 3810, cannot reduce overall credits.

Req. for ACCO majors.

BUAD 4010 Business in Film
Upper Division Business Elective.

BULA 3001 Legal and Ethical Environment of Business *Prereq: Jr. Standing*
Ethics Structured Elective: Req. for ACCO majors. All other majors can consider except FINA-AIM students.
Upper Division Business Elective.

MANA 3002 Business and its Environment *Prereq: Jr. Standing*
Ethics Structured Elective: All majors can consider except ACCO and FINA-AIM students. Upper Division Business Elective.

Engaging Social Systems and Values 2 (ESSV2): Business Courses

BULA 4001 Business Law for Accounting *Prereq: Jr. Standing*
Req. for ACCO majors. Upper Division Business Elective for all other majors.

MANA 3035 Diversity in Organizations *Prereq: Jr. Standing*
HURE Major Elective or Upper Division Business Elective.

In summer, students enrolled in the 1986 or 3986 courses will also be eligible.
