## GSO All-Council Meeting

On Thursday, September 25, from 12 to 1 p.m., GSO convened its Council Meeting with executive leaders, academic representatives, and university committee representatives in attendance. The meeting focused on clarifying roles and responsibilities to better serve the graduate student community.

Representatives were reminded of their key duties, including promoting GSO communications, events, and opportunities, and providing updates from their academic units or university committees. Additionally, all academic representatives are expected to host one internal Town Hall each in the fall and spring semesters.

The GSO extended thanks to representatives who have already hosted their Town Halls and encouraged students to reach out to their <u>academic representatives</u> to learn when upcoming sessions will be held in their departments.

# Town Hall #1 - Recap

On Thursday, October 2, the Graduate Student Organization (GSO) hosted its first Town Hall of the semester from 12 to 1 PM via MS Teams. The event provided graduate students with an opportunity to engage in open dialogue about challenges, opportunities, updates, and events affecting their community.

The Town Hall welcomed the following guest speakers:

Dr. Scott D'Urso, Acting Dean of the Graduate School, who offered a warm welcome and brief remarks at the start of the meeting.

Mr. Juan Carlos Ampie, Director of Student Media, encouraged graduate students to explore the <u>Marquette Wire</u>, which includes TV, radio, newspaper, and magazine content creation. He highlighted ways students could get involved and share their perspectives through these media channels.

Dr. Alyson Gerdes and Dr. Nakia Gordo presented the Whole Person Wellness Program that is open to all graduate students in spring 2026. The program is a study that offers multiple approaches to improving your overall health. The presenters described how students could participate in the study and benefit from its comprehensive wellness strategies.

Dr. Jodi Blahnik shared insights from the 2025 Marquette University Climate Study Survey. She encouraged graduate students to take part in listening and feedback sessions or submit their thoughts via the <u>Campus Climate Survey Feedback Form</u>. The survey collects information about students' perceptions of the university's culture and its impact on the well-being of students, faculty, and staff.

The Town Hall also gave the GSO an opportunity to respond to student concerns submitted through the <u>Graduate Student Anonymous Communication Form</u>. One recurring topic was health insurance for both international and domestic graduate students.

International Student Health Insurance Plan: An international graduate student sought clarity on health, vision and dental coverage. The GSO reached out to the Office of International Education (OIE) for plan clarification. According to the plan, vision and dental insurance can be purchased through the My Account Portal, with costs varying by individual circumstances. Routine eye exams for adults are covered once every 12 months, though glasses and contacts are not included, and dental coverage

applies only in cases of injury. Students adding minor children to their plans receive partial dental coverage and full coverage for eye exams with a small copay.

Domestic Student Health Insurance: Another health insurance-related concern was the absence of a university-offered graduate student health insurance plan. Students with assistantships issued through the Graduate School (excludes non-Marquette issued assistantships via grants, fellowships, scholarships, etc.) are provided a supplemental stipend of \$400 in the fall and \$400 in the spring, which can be used at the student's discretion, including for health insurance.

Students seeking a health insurance plan are encouraged to contact <u>Todd Catlin</u> at <u>Transitional Health</u> <u>Benefits</u>, which offers free consultations to explore plans as well as sign-up assistance. Transitional Health Benefits will help students explore a variety of insurance options, including ACA/Marketplace plans, dental coverage, international travel insurance, and more. The GSO has reached out to university leadership to learn more about the topic of student health insurance which may include the possibility of conducting a new graduate student health insurance survey.

Writing Groups: Graduate students also expressed interest in writing groups to foster community and support academic work. The GSO sent out a survey to the graduate student body to gauge interest and best days and time to schedule the groups. The survey received 65 responses in favor of offering writing groups. Per survey responses, the GSO partnered with the Graduate School and Raynor Library to offer the writing groups every Monday from 9am-Noon and Tuesday from Noon-4:30pm; beginning on Monday, November 10 and Tuesday, November 11, 2025 in Raynor 134.

Copy Editing Services: Finally, the topic of professional copy editing services was raised. While the Ott Writing Center currently provides writing support, it does not offer copy editing. The GSO is continuing discussions with the Graduate School to explore potential future support for students preparing theses, dissertations, and professional publications.

Be sure to attend the next Town Hall meeting on Thursday, November 13 from 12 - 1 pm via MS Teams. Town Halls are intentionally held online to allow for flexibility and to be inclusive of our online graduate student community.
