

ADVANCE FACULTY AWARDED MILLIONS

Associate Professor, <u>Dr. Bing Yu</u>, and Professor, <u>Dr. Brian Schmit</u>, both in the joint department of Biomedical Engineering, have been awarded more than \$4.75 million in NIH (National Institutes of Health) funds. Dr. Yu received a **\$1.54 million** NIH grant to develop and implement an imaging tool for use in surgical



settings.The goal is to significantly reduce the unnecessary additional surgery for women who undergo breast conserving surgery. Others on Yu's team include: <u>Dr. Taly Gilat-Schmidt</u>, <u>Dr. Dong Hye Ye</u>, Dr. Tina Yen, and Dr. Julie Jorns. Dr. Schmit received a **\$3.34 million** ROI research grant from NIH to improve walking, balance and community mobility in people with multiple sclerosis. Their study will utilize a novel combination of high-intensity exercise on a treadmill that moves unexpectedly to improve balance and increase walking speed. Others on Schmit's team include: <u>Dr. Allison Hyngstrom</u>, <u>Dr. Naveen Bansal</u>, Dr. T. George Hornby, Dr. David H. Mattson, Cris Henderson, Dr. Ahmed Obeidat, and Dr. Kelly P.
