Volume: Approximately 20 cubic feet

Description: 6 series include Native Catholic records:

/1 "Province Correspondence" Inclusive dates: 1863-1932

Volume: 5 volumes

Description: "Lettere Edificanti Della Provincia Turinese, 1863-1932," 5 volumes, each with index; correspondence between the provincial (Turinese Province, Turin, Italy) and mission superiors, re: Jesuit missions among Indians and Eskimos in Idaho, Montana, Washington, and Alaska; in Italian.

/2 "Province Reports Jesuit Generalate, ARSI California 1003-I-1" Inclusive Dates: 1891-1931

Volume: Less than 10% of .5 cubic foot

Description: Annual reports noting the principal activities and ministries of the houses within the province.

- A. Consultation Minutes, 1891-1931, less than 10% of 2 volumes; re: dialogues between the provincial superior and board of consulters on problems of specific houses
- B. Missione Della California, Torino Province, 1898, less than 10% of 29 pages; re: overview of activities, including Jesuit Indian missions of the Pacific Northwest
- C. Folder 4 (less than 10% of folder): Phoenix, 1928-1929; re: Faculties granted by local bishop

/3 "House Files, 323"

Inclusive dates: 1959-1968, 1984

Volume: Less than 5% of approximately .3 cubic foot

Description: Arranged alphabetically by Jesuit house; re: correspondence, clippings, parish and school reports, publications, photographs, and scrapbooks:

- A. 323E: Gardnerville, Nevada, St. Gall's Mission, 1959-1968, 1984; less than 5% of 1 folder
- B. 323F: Brigham City, Utah, St. Henry's Church, 1959-1968, 1984; less than 5% of 6 folders; re: Navajo Indian students of Intermountain Government School and Reverend Joseph Clark, S.J.

Inclusive dates: 1910s-1940s

Volume: Approximately .4 cubic foot

Description: Albums arranged alphabetically by Jesuit house

- A. Bassett, Daniel, S.J. Slide Collection, 1910s-1920s, approximately .2 cubic foot; mostly black and white
  - 1. Holy Rosary Mission (Oglala), Pine Ridge Reservation, South Dakota, 1910s-1920s, approximately 160 slides; include [Nicholas] Black Elk, Catholic Sioux Congress of 1920, Jesuits, and Sisters of St. Francis of Penance and Christian Charity
  - St. Francis Mission (Brulé), Rosebud Reservation, South Dakota, 1910s-1920s, approximately 6 slides: Includes Big Turkey, Bone Shirt, Hollow Horn Bear, and Short Bull
  - 3. St. Ignatius Mission (Kootenai and Salish), Flathead Reservation, Montana, approximately 6 slides: Also includes Jesuits
- B. Hubbard, [Reverend] Bernard R. (1888-1962), S.J., ca. 1920s-1930s, 261 lantern slides; mostly color, re:
  - 1. Alaska panhandle, 252 slides, ca. 1930s, unidentified Indian village (Tlingit?) and geography
  - United States Great Plains and Southwest, 9 slides, ca. 1920s, unidentified Indians

/6 "Biographical Files and Personnel Papers"

Inclusive Dates: 1910s-1960s

Volume: Approximately 19 cubic feet

Description: Arranged alphabetically by surname and includes an unknown amount within approximately 53 cubic feet; re: personal papers by and/ or about the author or subject; notable authors/subjects pertaining to American Indians and Eskimos:

- A. Dunne, Peter Masten (1889-1957), S.J., ca. 1925-1957, possibly 25% of 5 cubic feet, re: Southwestern history research
- B. Fox, Francis (1921-1989), S.J., ca. 1957-1989, approximately 5 cubic feet, re: Southwestern history research
- C. Hubbard, [Reverend] Bernard R. S.J., 1930s-1962, approximately 3 cubic feet; re: correspondence, reports, and articles, ca. 1930s-1962; re: Eskimo and Indians and geography in Alaska
- D. Polzer, [Reverend] Charles (1930-2003), S.J., ca. 1953-2003, possibly 25% of 40 cubic feet; unprocessed, re: Documentary Relations of the Southwest Project, which pertains in part to Indians in Arizona, California, New Mexico, and Texas
