History: The Military Ordinate of the United States was erected in 1957 and elevated as the Archdiocese for the Military Services, U.S.A. (Washington, District of Columbia) in 1985. Previously since 1917, Catholic chaplains in the United States Armed Forces worldwide were administered by a military vicar. It is believed that Native American Catholics have served in the Armed Forces since the Revolutionary War and throughout the 20th century.

1898 Sister M. Joseph, C.A.S. [Josephine Two Bears] (Hunkpapa), Sister M. Gertrude, C.A.S. [Ella Clark] (Hunkpapa), Sister M. Bridget, C.A.S. [Anna Pleets] (Hunkpapa), and Sister M. Anthony, C.A.S. [Susan Bordeaux] (Hunkpapa) were U.S. Army nurses who administered a hospital at Camp Columbia, Havana, Cuba; they were the first American Indian women to officially serve in the U.S. Armed Forces
