History: St. Ann Church was an Ojibwa Indian parish, 1886-ca. 1920s, attended by diocesan priests from The Most Holy Name of Jesus Church, Assinins.

Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: 1843-1949

Volume: .4 cubic foot

Description: The records at St. Ann Church are not organized according to a classification scheme. Consequently, description is by record type. Although St. Ann's was administered from Most Holy Name of Jesus until 1949, Holy Name's sacramental records from 1843-1949 are at St. Ann's.

- A. Sacramental records, 1843-1949, 3 volumes: baptisms, marriages, and deaths for Most Holy Name of Jesus Church and St. Ann Church
- B. "Status Animarium" or census record, ca. 1880, 1 volume: for Most Holy Name of Jesus Church; lists names of family members, birth and death dates, and whether sacraments were received
- C. Financial and Statistical Reports, 1928-1947, 1 folder: annual reports for Most Holy Name of Jesus Church
