Description: Sacramental records for St. Anne's and its attended Indian missions and stations; records from 1934-1950, when St. Anne's Mission was administered by Benedictines from Mahnomen and Beaulieu, are kept at St. Anne's; baptisms, marriages, and deaths, 1934-present; first communions, 1935-present; confirmations, 1939-present.
