History: The Ursulines were founded in Italy in 1535 and made their first U.S. foundation in 1727. They established the Montana Missionary Province in 1900, which was succeeded by the Western Province in 1932. The Ursulines Western Province and its predecessor staffed the following Indian and Eskimo schools, missions, and parishes:
