History: Established in 2000, the Franciscan Tewa Missions provide joint administration for three Tewa Indian parishes: San Diego Church, Tesuque Pueblo, Santa Clara Church, Santa Clara Pueblo, and San Ildefonso Church, San Ildefonso Pueblo.

Franciscans and diocesan priests from Santa Clara sttended the following missions:

1772-1846 (no longer Santo Tomás de Abiquiú Mission (various and Indian) Mestizos), Abiquiu
1858-1866 (became a San Ildefonso Mission (Tewa), San Ildefonso Pueblo parish)
