History: San Antonio de Padua Church is a non-Indian parish that is believed to have had some Tiwa Indian parishioners. Diocesan priests from San Antonio have attended San Lorenzo Mission, Picuris Pueblo, Picuris Reservation, 1879-present.

History of San Lorenzo Mission

1600s-1726	Franciscans (Santo Evangelico Province, Mexico City, Mexico) established and attended San Lorenzo Mission (Tiwa) from an unknown mission
1726-1820	Franciscans attended San Lorenzo from St. John's, Ohkay Owingeh/ San Juan
1820-1851	Franciscans attended San Lorenzo from an unknown mission
1851-1860, 1866-1878, 1882-1884	Became a parish; diocesan priests administered San Lorenzo Church
1879-1882, 1884-present	Diocesan priests attended San Lorenzo from San Antonio

Diocesan priests from San Lorenzo attended San Antonio de Padua Mission, Penasco, 1866-1878 (became a parish).
