Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: 1839-present

Volume: Approximately 1 cubic foot

Description: The records at St. Paul Mission are not organized according to a classification scheme. Consequently, description is by record type.

- A. Sacramental records, 1839-present, 6 volumes: baptisms, 1839-present; marriages, 1922-present; deaths, 1918-present; first communions, 1944-present; baptisms from 1839 to ca. 1870s were transcribed by Reverend Henry Westropp, S.J., ca. 1910s
- B. Census record, 1940s, 1 folder: lists members of each household in the parish
- C. Financial records, 1920s-present, 1 folder; primarily deeds, abstracts, and other documentation dealing with land transactions
