Description: Reverend John Q. O'Connell, C.M. (1921-1999), 1953, 1999; 1
folder; re: biographical sheet, news clipping, correspondence, photograph,
and obituary from his funeral, which noted his pastoral work with American
Indians and the Kateri Circle of Colorado.

/2 "Bishop Joseph Rosati Papers"

Inclusive dates: Between 1812-1954

Volume: Few items within approximately .8 cubic foot

Description: The papers of Bishop Rosati (1789-1843), C.M., of St. Louis,
Missouri, are believed to include a few items pertaining to Catholic Indian
missions.

History of the Vincentians, Midwest Province

Established in France in 1625, the Vincentians (Congregation of the Mission,
made their first foundation in the United States in 1818, and established
the Midwest Province in 1888.
