The Participating Faculty Committee addresses issues of importance to members of the Marquette faculty, full and part-time, hired on a participating or non-tenure track line. These issues include, but are not limited to, total rewards (including compensation and benefits), professional development, recognition, inclusion, and performance review and promotion. The committee consists of participating faculty members, as well as an appointee from the Office of University Relations. ## Our work to improve the participating faculty experience:

- New teaching excellence award for part-time faculty: The Office of the Provost has created a new teaching excellence award to honor part-time faculty. The Part-time Faculty Teaching Excellence Award will honor one part-time faculty member annually who demonstrates an outstanding commitment to student growth, development, and welfare through effective teaching and student learning. The award will be presented at the annual Père Marquette Dinner in May and will include a \$5,000 award. All part-time faculty at Marquette University who have taught at least five courses within the past five years (by January 2025) and are teaching in the 2024-2025 academic year are eligible. The nomination form will be available in October.
- Multi-year contracts for full-time participating faculty: This year, the Participating Faculty Committee plans to review the eligibility criteria for multi-year contracts.
- Participating faculty policies and resources: Compiled on this webpage, including everything
  from mentoring and onboarding information to contract policies and promotion criteria for fulltime participating faculty.
