Professor of Philosophy

PHIL 3505 – Philosophy and Film | MW 5pm-6:15pm

In this course, we will explore the relationship between philosophical ideas and film, especially narrative film. We will pay special attention to the ways that narrative films are susceptible to philosophical reflection and, more controversially, the way that narrative films might exemplify a way of doing philosophy.
