¹ This number represents the number of eligible voters who accessed the ballots; 7,247 of these eligible voters were full time students able to vote on the ballots for MUSG president/EVP and academic senators. Completion rates varied in specific college populations.

² Voter turnout of 23% of all eligible voters compares to election turnout of 29.7% in spring 2024, 25.5% in spring 2023, 30% in spring 2022, 24.3% in spring 2021, 33.5% in fall 2020, and 31.1% in spring 2019. Fall 2020 turnout rate is noted because the all-university seats and academic senator elections were held in fall 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

³ This percentage reflects the 1% reduction in total votes for a campaign violation.

Campaign Violation Ruling
The Elections Committee Convened at 5pm on Thursday, 3/27/2025 to discuss an inquiry they received regarding the Wills/Akosah ticket blocking the opposing ticket candidates from registered campaign social media sites. Upon deliberation, the Election Committee agreed that this action was in violation of this rule That "All registered accounts must be made public during the entire election period." A 1% reduction of the total votes for the Wills/Akosah ticket was imposed as a result.
