Position Overview

Sustainability Interns play a key role in advancing campus sustainability by promoting environmental responsibility, social equity, and student engagement across campus. Working in collaboration with the Sustainability Specialist and a team of interns, students in this role will focus on peer-to-peer education programs. Helping students build awareness, adopt sustainable behaviors, and take meaningful action that reduces Marquette’s ecological footprint. Interns will develop and lead student centered outreach efforts, organize interactive learning opportunities, and empower peers to make informed sustainable choices in daily campus life. This position offers hands-on experience in sustainability leadership, community-based education, and program development & management.

5. Flexible to attend meetings, tabling, and on campus events for engagement efforts.
6. Maintains frequent, timely, and active communication with stakeholders, student groups, and co-workers.
7. Track progress and outcomes of sustainability projects, develop competency to communicate sustainability objectives and goals to community partners and students.
8. Serve as a peer ambassador and role model for sustainable practices, encouraging fellow students to adopt responsible behaviors in their daily lives.
9. Attend and support Arrupe Center events including but not limited to: Connect and Serve, Justice in Action, Make a Difference Day, Neighbors Helping Neighbors, Marquette Community Day of Service, Community Service Fairs, etc.
