ECONOMIC IMPACT

2,600+

faculty and staff employed by Marquette University

\$15 million+

generated annually in **visitor spending** from campus events and visits

\$15 million+

generated annually from **international-student spending**

\$500 million+

invested in **local construction** over the past 10 years

\$100 million+

spent annually on **supplies/services**, mostly with Wisconsin-based companies

ALUMNI ECONOMIC IMPACT

1,500+

new Marquette graduates contribute an additional **\$12 million+ in tax revenue** to the nation's economy every year

84%

of Marquette undergraduate students are **employed full time or attending graduate school** six months postgraduation

55%

of Marquette undergraduates **remain in Wisconsin after graduating**; another 63% of Marquette graduate and professional students stay in the state after graduating (2024 surveys)

new Marquette Nurses graduate each year to address nursing shortages

320

new Marquette health care professionals including dentists, physician assistants, physical therapists and occupational therapists graduate each year

30,000+ patients served

in Wisconsin through Marquette University School of Dentistry, totaling **\$16 million in oral health services** (2024)

\$45,000+

value of **physical therapy services provided pro bono annually** through the ComMUity Clinics (2023). Marquette also provides low-fee services to the community through our Behavior Clinic, Neuro Recovery Clinic, Next Step Clinic, and Speech and Language Clinic.

\$50 million

in annual research funding expenditures that support global efforts to impact clean water, human health and sustainable energy

\$800,000

invested into Milwaukee over the past decade through **12 unique collaborative, community-engaged research projects** funded by the President's/Chancellor's Challenges

CORPORATE PARTNERSHIPS

500+

local and national **corporate partnerships**, providing internships, co-ops and industry relations

~40 student business concepts

launched annually; projects have included **food insecurity solutions, mental health apps, and tutoring platforms**

SAFE COMMUNITIES

Marquette's commitment to the **Near West Side Partners** neighborhood organization as a founding member. NWSP's mission seeks to revitalize and sustain the Near West Side as a thriving business/residential corridor through resident involvement. NWSP is now considered a national model for collaborative neighborhood revitalization initiatives.

68 public safety professionals

including **48 sworn law officers** in the Marquette University Police Department, who patrol the Marquette campus and surrounding neighborhood, answering 25,000 service calls a year with an average clearance rate above the national average for serious crime

Marquette's Educational Opportunity Program has transformed the lives of **thousands of first-generation and low-income students** from pre-college through graduate education since its inception in 1969

invested annually in **scholarships** to provide accessible education

Benefits of a *bachelor's degree*

America's higher education system is a strength that benefits our country as much as our students. Higher education fuels the U.S. economy and keeps America globally competitive with vital scientific research, industry collaborations and technological advancements.

The return on investment of a bachelor's degree is steadily rising, which makes getting a college education or an advanced degree a smart move.

\$1 million

individuals with bachelor's degrees **earn an average \$1 million** more over their lifetime than those with only a high school diploma. The lifetime ROI for a Marquette bachelor's degree is nearly **\$1 million more than the average lifetime ROI** for both public and private universities. *(Georgetown's Center on Education and the Workforce)*

6%

increased earnings' percentage for college-led households over 20 years as compared to 2% for high-school-led households *(U.S. Census Bureau, 2025)*

3/4 jobs

are projected to require some postsecondary education by 2031; 42% will require a bachelor's degree or higher. This means there are **more job opportunities** in competitive fields like health care, engineering, business, technology and education for college graduates. *(Georgetown's Center on Education and the Workforce)*

87%

of bachelor's degree holders report **higher financial well-being because of their education**, 20 percentage points higher than any other group. *(Federal Reserve's Economic Well-Being of U.S. Households, 2023)*

Graduates of Catholic universities

are more likely to report an **ideal life and stronger sense of direction, weigh morality in decision-making**, and find **greater social and community fulfillment** than secular college graduates. *(Higher Education Holistic Impact Report, 2024)*
