Joann Harris-Comodore, MA

Joann Harris-Comodore is the Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Neu-Life Community Development, a nonprofit providing educational, recreational, and workforce development programming for Milwaukee's youth founded in 2000. Joann has dedicated her career to the service of others, always demonstrating the vision and the ability to pivot to meet the greatest need.

Joann began her career for United/Unicare Healthcare, where she served as a dietitian for three years and a health care administrator for 22 years. In 1994, upon observing an increased need for seniors who required support services and care, Joann became an entrepreneur when she founded Residential Living Services, Inc. Soon thereafter, she founded Residential Living Services II and Residential Living Services Apartments. She also owned and operated Tendercare Transportation Company, all of which provided an array of services to senior citizens.

Joann also works with the Milwaukee North Avenue Marketplace BID 32, the Wisconsin Assisted Living Association, and the Zonta Club of Milwaukee, an international women advocacy organization.

Joann grew up and was educated in Wisconsin. She received a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in nutrition from Mt. Mary College, a BS degree in business administration from University of Wisconsin-Madison, and a Master's degree in long-term administration from University of Wisconsin-Madison. She is married with one adult child.

TRANSFORMATIONAL CAMPUS LEADERSHIP

Melissa M. Shew. PhD

Dr. Melissa Shew (Philosophy) is Associate Director of Teaching Excellence in the Center for Teaching and Learning, where she helps lead initiatives related to teaching and learning at Marquette. Dr. Shew has received numerous teaching awards herself, including Marquette's highest teaching award in 2023, and is also the Faculty Director of Marquette's Executive

MBA Program. Partially due to having taught high school girls for 5 years in addition to teaching at the university level for over 15 years, Dr. Shew has a special interest in supporting women and nonbinary people in their education and careers.

As an active and wide-ranging scholar, Dr. Shew created and edited Philosophy for Girls: An Invitation to the Life of Thought (with Kim Garchar, 2020) and On the Vocation of the Educator in This Moment (with Jennifer Maney, PhD, 2021); gave a TEDx Talk, "Women and Intellectual Empowerment" (2021); and published The Power of Intellectual Joy for Women at Work (2023) with a corresponding workbook through IWL. Dr. Shew has presented her work on intellectual joy and women's leadership to over a thousand people in organizations of all kinds and is currently working to adapt this scholarship for intellectual joy in education today.

At Marquette, Dr. Shew has held a range of leadership positions on campus and has special interests in advancing equity at Marquette as well as leading efforts around advancing intellectual joy for all. Dr. Shew is married, and her two children (9 and 10) joke that she goes to work to give "pep talks" at Marquette every day.

Maria G. Tijerina Ibarra

Maria Guadalupe Tijerina Ibarra advocates for equity and inclusion in higher education, which has helped transform Marquette University and uplift the broader community. As a graduate student in Student Affairs in Higher Education, she passionately elevates marginalized voices, advocates for systemic change, and cultivates inclusive spaces for all. Her work earned her a position on MU's Provost-

appointed DREAMers Support Committee; and through Marquette DREAMers, Tijerina Ibarra has led initiatives such as UndocuAlly Week. As the inaugural Inclusive Excellence Graduate Fellow in Marguette's Office of Inclusion and Belonging, she launched Latinas Unidas, a program dedicated to mentorship, connection, and empowerment for Latinas in higher education.

Tijerina Ibarra's leadership extends beyond local initiatives. Her work overall and as a Core Committee member of the Ignatian Solidarity Network's National Undocu Network has garnered widespread recognition. She has been featured in media interviews, including Milwaukee PBS.

This fall, Tijerina Ibarra will begin her PhD in Educational Policy and Leadership, continuing her mission to create a more accessible, inclusive, and equitable higher education system. Tijerina Ibarra's leadership aims to both break barriers and build pathways for others to rise.




